

WHERE DO I THROW IT?

Guide to correct waste sorting

<p style="text-align: center;">ORGANIC WASTE</p>	<p>Meal leftovers, vegetable scraps, fruit peels, eggshells, coffee grounds, tea, chamomile and herbal-tea filters, extinguished ash, dried flowers, cork, untreated wood shavings, soiled pizza boxes cut into small pieces, natural cat litter, natural fibres, paper napkins and tissues (NOT WHEN USED FOR A COLD). ATTENTION! Do not include non-organic waste, liquid waste, grass cuttings or pruning waste. Use COMPOSTABLE BAGS only.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">PAPER</p>	<p>Newspapers, magazines, books, notebooks, advertising leaflets, albums and drawing sheets, cardboard, Tetra Pak food and beverage containers (for example milk cartons), paper bags, wrapping paper, paper boxes, cardstock and cardboard. Small cardboard boxes must be flattened, emptied of any foreign contents and disposed of together with paper. ATTENTION! Do not include paper napkins or tissues, dirty, greasy or wet paper, baking paper, waxed or plastic-coated paper, receipts, glossy drawing paper, parchment paper, carbon paper, sandpaper, or plastic-coated boxes and covers.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">PLASTIC</p>	<p>Plastic bottles and containers for food and detergents, plastic caps, jars for creams, sauces and yoghurt, cellophane and packaging film, plastic bags and pouches, plastic and polystyrene trays, food films and packaging, plastic plates and cups without food residues, toothpaste tubes, clothes hangers, polystyrene, plastic crates and nets for fruit and vegetables. All containers must be completely emptied of solid or liquid residues; washing is not required. All containers must be emptied and reduced in volume. ATTENTION! Do not include rubber objects, plastic cutlery and straws, toys, plastic chairs, pipes, syringes, insulin needles, or any 'hard' plastic objects not classified as packaging, i.e. not intended to contain drinks, food, detergents or cleaning products. Expose paper-collection bags and paper separately inside the grey-lid container on the days specified in the calendar.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">GLASS - METALS</p>	<p>Glass bottles, jars and small jars without solid or liquid residues, aluminium trays and foil without food residues, metal packaging, metal and tinplate containers, metal caps and lids, cans and tins, canned-food containers, aluminium foil. ATTENTION! Do not include light bulbs, ceramics, porcelain, neon tubes, glass sheets, mirrors, Pyrex containers, wired glass, opal glass (perfume bottles), crystal, paint or solvent cans. Dispose of this waste inside the container WITHOUT BAGS.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">NON-RECYCLABLE RESIDUAL WASTE</p>	<p>Disposable masks and gloves, paper napkins and tissues (when used for a cold, according to ISS guidance), baking paper, plastic-coated paper, carbon paper, waxed paper, adhesive paper, paper greasy or soiled with food, receipts, adhesive tape, disposable plastic cutlery and straws, ceramics, porcelain, clay, terracotta, mirrors, crystal, Pyrex, CDs, DVDs, VHS tapes, stationery items, photographs, film rolls, basins, pots and saucers, small toys, adult incontinence pads, nappies, bed pads, sanitary pads, combs and brushes, toothbrushes, cosmetics, disposable blades and razors, chewing gum, mussel shells, extinguished cigarette butts, lighters, sponges, electrostatic cloths, wet wipes, rags, sweeping residues, vacuum-cleaner bags, doormats, small quantities of clothing in poor condition, tights, nylon, elastic bands, synthetic cat litter, plasters, cotton buds, cotton wool, syringes and insulin needles with a protective needle case. Include only waste comparable to municipal waste. Waste that is not comparable to municipal waste must be disposed of in accordance with current regulations. ATTENTION! Residual dry waste is not unsorted waste. It consists only of what remains after careful sorting and separate collection. DO NOT USE BLACK BAGS.</p>
